



**EDRF Grants Awarded for WNC Flood Relief
Total to Date: \$267,500**

Approved 11/10/2021

\$10,000 to **Smart Start of Transylvania County** to repair the flood-damaged outdoor learning and play area of a Rosman childcare center so that it continues to meet licensing requirements. Outdoor activity supports positive developmental progress in children, and these areas provide much needed opportunities for fresh air and social distancing.

Approved 10/21/2021

\$10,000 to **Canton Middle School** in Haywood County to purchase technology, equipment and other teacher support supplies that would have been paid for through activities made impossible by the flood

Approved 9/22/2021

\$95,000 to **Mountain Projects** to support the rehabilitation of approximately five homes in Haywood County to livable standards and provide funds for increased staff costs related to flood response work

\$10,000 grant to **Pisgah High School** in Haywood County to purchase technology, equipment and other teacher support supplies that would have been paid for through activities made impossible by the flood

Approved 9/16/2021

\$10,000 to **Smart Start of Transylvania County** to purchase damaged or destroyed items for indoor and outdoor learning spaces that are necessary to meet licensing requirements

\$5,000 to **Grace Church in the Mountains** to provide rental assistance to displaced residents

Approved 9/8/2021

\$10,000 to **Jewish Family Services of WNC** to provide mental health counseling to adult (18+) uninsured and low-income underinsured victims of recent flooding in Haywood and Transylvania counties

\$10,000 to **United Way of Haywood County** to offset expenses and capacity needs related to managing the Recover Haywood program

Approved 9/1/2021

\$75,000 to **The Community Kitchen** to purchase equipment necessary to reopen its community facility that provides meals and food distribution in Haywood County

\$10,000 to **Thirtieth Judicial District Domestic Violence Sexual Assault Alliance** to provide temporary housing and replace household goods for flood victims

\$10,000 to **Mountain Projects** to restore equipment and material damaged by flooding for Canton Head Start and Canton Senior Center

\$10,000 to the **American Red Cross serving Western North Carolina** to provide cleaning supplies, access to health and mental health care, and replacement of prescription medicine and medical devices, as well as immediate financial assistance for basic needs, including food, clothing and lodging in Haywood and Transylvania counties

\$2,500 to **Beaverdam Community Development Club** to continue feeding the community while serving an increase in clients due to the recent flood
