### How We Came to Be

Women for Women launched in February 2005 and had 213 founding members in the first year, including "founding mothers" Eleanor Owen, Pat Smith, Marla Adams, Sue McClinton, and Janice Brumit. In 2006, we awarded our first grants, totaling \$213,000, providing for basic needs to women in our region.

# We take action through funding & advocacy

Since 2006, we've granted over **\$5 million** for basic needs, economic self-sufficiency, health, education, and security.

In addition to our grant-making, we are a leading voice on women's issues in the region, educating and advocating for social change on a regional, state, and national level. Together, this advocacy work and our grants process bring about the resources, access, and policies that drive change at the systemic level.

## How Membership Works

When you join *Women for Women*, you make a three-year commitment to gift \$1,200 each year (all tax-deductible). Of the total membership dues, \$200 goes to our administrative fund and \$1,000 goes to the grant fund.



Those member funds, combined with spendable income from The Community Foundation's

Women's Fund, are granted out to help women and girls in 18 counties in Western North Carolina. The more members, the more funds we can distribute.

Each member has a voice and a vote in how the funds are distributed.
